**The New Moon:** Thursday (10.6.2021) at 9:15 a.m. and 9 *chalakim*

**Kiddush Levana (Sanctification of the Moon):**

from Sunday night, the eve of 4 Tammuz (13.6.2021) to Thursday night, the eve of 15 Tammuz (24.6.2021) 3:37 a.m.

**Tekufat Tammuz:** Wednesday night, 28 Tammuz (8.7.2021) at 1:30 a.m.

**Kiddush Levana** (according to Oriental communities): from Thursday night, 8 Tammuz (17.6.2021)

Second day of *Rosh Chodesh Tammuz*, Friday, 1 Tammuz (11.6.2021). *Rosh Chodesh* prayer service.

**Shabbat Parashat Balak, 16 Tammuz (26.6.2021)**

The *Haftara* is read from *Micha* 5:6: *v'haya she'erit ya'akov* to 6:8: *v'hatzna lechet*.

**Mincha:** Three men are called up to read from *Parashat Pinchas*. *Avot*, Chapter 6.

**Sunday, 17 Tammuz (27.6.2021) – Fast Day**

First dawn: 3:45 a.m. (in Israel). We recite *selichot*, *avinu malkeinu*, *vaychal*.

**Mincha:** *vaychal*, *haftara*, *'aneinu*, *avinu malkeinu*; *birkat kohanim* in accordance with custom. The fast ends 18 minutes after sunset – at 8:02 p.m. (in Israel).

## The Three Weeks of Bein Ha-Metsarim (June 27, 2021 – July 18, 2021)

From the 17<sup>th</sup> (*yod-zayin*) of *Tammuz* (27.6.2021) until after the 9<sup>th</sup> of *Av* (*Tish'a b'Av*) (18.7.2021) – weddings are not celebrated, new clothes are not worn and new crockery (dishes, etc.) are not used, nor do we buy them in order to use them after *Tish'a b'Av*. We do not take haircuts, we do not recite *birkat shehecheyanu* when eating a new fruit – though on *Shabbat* some say that this *beracha* can be recited. It is permitted to recite *shehecheyanu* over any pleasure that cannot be postponed. A *se'uda* of *shidduchim* is permitted until *Rosh Chodesh Av*, and a *se'udat mitzva* – such as that of a *b'rit mila*, *pidyon ha-ben* and *siyyum masechet* (seudah celebration upon the completion of a Talmudic tractate) – is permitted even with meat, wine and even after *Rosh Chodesh*, so long as no dancing takes place. Happy music is forbidden. Going on excursions and bathing, even pleasurable bathing, are permitted until *Rosh Chodesh Av*. *Shidduchim* – without a *se'uda* – are permitted, even on *Tish'a b'Av* itself. It is permitted to cut one's fingernails in respect for *Shabbat* even after *Rosh Chodesh*. The pious (*Chassidim ve-anshei ma'ase*) recite *tikkun chatzot* every afternoon, from the 17<sup>th</sup> of *Tammuz* to the eve of *Tish'a b'Av*, except for *'erev Shabbat* and *Rosh Chodesh*.
