Adar I 5784

February 9, 2024 – March 9, 2024

The New Moon: Friday night (9.2.2024), at 9:29 p.m., and 5 *chalakim*.

Kiddush Levana (Sanctification of the Moon):

from Tuesday night, 5 *Adar I* (13.2.2024) to Thursday night, 14 *Adar I* (22.2.2024) the entire night

Kiddush Levana (according to Oriental communities): from Saturday night, 9 *Adar I* (17.2.2024)

Friday, 30 Shvat (9.2.2024) – the first day of Rosh Chodesh Adar: *Rosh Chodesh* prayers.

Shabbat, Parshat Mishpatim, 1 Adar I (10.2.2024) - The second day of Rosh Chodesh

Ya'aleh v'yavo. Hatzit Hallel. Two Torah scrolls are taken out. In the first we read the weekly portion and call up seven men to this reading. *Chatzi Kaddish.* In the second scroll we read the *Maftir* from *Parashat Pinchas: Uv'yom HaShabat, Uv'rashei Chodshechem.* The *Haftara* is read from Isaiah (Yesha'yah) 66: *ko amar Hashem: ha-shamayim kis'i*, and we repeat the verse: *v'haya middei chodesh. Av Harachamim* is not recited.

Mussaf shel Shabbat v'shel Rosh Chodesh.

In most prayer-books the following words are omitted before *ki be-amcha Yisrael baharta: kaddesheinu be-mitzvotecha ve-ten chelkeinu be-toratecha... ve-hanchileinu Hashem Elokeinu be-ahava uve-ratzon shabbat kodshecha... ki be-ammecha Yisrael...* etc. (*Aruch Ha-Shulchan* and *Minhag HaGra*)

If one has erred and recited only regular *Mussaf shel shabbat* – if one remembers before moving his feet at the end of the prayer, he repeats from *atta yatzarta*; if one only remembers after completing the prayer, he repeats the prayer from the beginning. *Shir shel yom. Bareckhi nafshi.*

Mincha: Three *aliyot* from Parshat **Truma**. *Tsidkatecha tzedek* is not recited. *Barechi nafshi.*

Shabbat Parshat Truma, 8 Adar I (17.2.2024)

Haftarah is read from *Melachim I (Kings) 5:26*, "V'Hashem natan chochma l'Shlomo" until 6:13 "ami Yisrael".

Mincha: Three *aliyot* from parashat **Titzaveh**.

Purim Katan, Friday, 14 Adar I (23.2.2024), *Tachanun* is not recited also on Thursday's *Mincha*.

Shabbat, Parshat Titzaveh, 15 Adar I (24.2.2024) - Purim Katan d'Mukafim

The *Haftara* is read from *Yechezkel 43:10* "v'Atta ben adam" to "Ne'um Hashem".

Mincha: Three *aliyot* from Parshat **Ki Tissa**.

Shabbat, Parshat Ki Tissa, 22 Adar I (2.3.2024)

The *Haftara* is read from *Kings I 18:1-39*: "Vayhi yamim rabbim" to "Hashem hu ha-Elokim". Sefardim begin from "Va-yishlach Achav".

Mincha: Three *aliyot* from Parshat **Vayakhel**.

Shabbat, Parshat Vayakhel, 29 Adar I (9.3.2024) – Shabbat Parshat Shkalim

Piyutim for Parshat *Shkalim* as customary. Two *sifrei Torah* are taken out. Seven *aliyot* from parashat *hashavua* are read in the first *sefer*. Half *kaddish. Maftir* is read in the second *sefer* from parashat *Ki Tisa, Shemot perek 30 psukim 11-16* from the beginning of the *parsha* until *lechaper al nafshotechem. Haftarah* is read from *Melachim II perek 12 psukim 1-17, Ben sheva shanim.* Sefardim read from *Melachim II perek 11 pasuk 17 vayichrot Yehoyada* until *perek 12 pasuk 17 lachohanim yihyu* and the first and last *pasuk* of the *haftara Machar Chodesh* is added.

It is customary not to call up a child for the *maftir*. We bless the new month of *Adar II*, which falls on Sunday and Monday (10-11.3.2024). *Av harachamim* is not said

The Molad: Sunday (10.3.2024) at 10:13 a.m. (and 6 *chalakim*).

Mincha. Three *aliyot* from *parashat P'kudei*. *Tzidkatcha tzedek* is not recited.

Sunday, 30 Adar I (10.3.2024) – the first day of Rosh Chodesh Adar II: Rosh Chodesh prayers.
